




When the dentures were ready, Juliet surprised him with a skirt steak dinner, which he could now enjoy with his dentures. He was super appreciative and incredibly thankful.

Facts about Delta and How to Protect Yourself

Delta is currently the predominant strain of the virus in the United States.

- The Delta variant is highly contagious, nearly twice as contagious as previous variants.
- Some data suggest the Delta variant might cause more severe illness than previous strains in unvaccinated persons.
- Unvaccinated people remain the greatest concern. The greatest risk of transmission is among unvaccinated people who are much more likely to contract, and therefore transmit the virus.
- Fully vaccinated people with Delta variant breakthrough infections can spread the virus to others. However, vaccinated people appear to be infectious for a shorter period: Previous variants typically produced less virus in the body of infected fully vaccinated people (breakthrough infections) than in unvaccinated people. In contrast, the Delta variant seems to produce the same high amount of virus in both unvaccinated and fully vaccinated people. However, like other variants, the amount of virus produced by Delta breakthrough infections in fully vaccinated people also goes down faster than infections in unvaccinated people. This means fully vaccinated people are likely infectious for less time than unvaccinated people.
- The COVID-19 vaccines authorized in the United States are highly effective at preventing severe disease and death, including against the Delta variant. But they are not 100% effective and some fully vaccinated people will become infected (called a breakthrough infection) and experience illness. For such people, the vaccine still provides them strong protection against serious illness and death.



Symptoms to Watch for:

- Stomach pain
- Sore throat
- Headache
- Stuffy nose
- Loss of appetite
- Vomiting
- Nausea
- Joint pain
- Hearing loss

Ways to Help Protect Against the Delta Variant Include:

- Wearing a mask over your nose and mouth while you're spending time around people from other households, especially when you're in poorly ventilated indoor spaces or crowded areas.
- Staying 6 feet away from people who aren't part of your household.
- Washing your hands frequently (or using hand sanitizer when soap and water aren't available)
- Steering clear of crowded indoor spaces, including poorly ventilated ones.
- Paying attention to local COVID-19 infection rates, including Delta variant rates, and avoiding unnecessary social contact with others when infection rates surge.
